On top of that, checks we received in the mail this week plus the second collection totaled a whopping \$9,641.17. That gives us a total of \$13,456.78, after only two weeks. God bless you!!! Again, the reason for this special collection is that the main boiler for the church and school is no longer operational. We only have the back up boiler, which is 37 years old. Our Buildings and Properties Committee decided on a steel boiler, which will cost \$50,000. The new boiler will be twice as efficient (85%) as the old boiler. It should pay for itself in 5 to 6 years. I wish to thank you very, very much for whatever you are able to give.

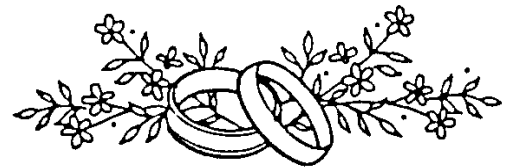
