PASTOR'S COLUMN

July 23, 2023

Dear Westside Catholic Family,

Last week we went through the first part of the Introductory Rites of the Mass. The beginning of Mass reminds us that we step out of the ordinary into the realm of the Heavenly banquet. The gestures, sounds, sights, and smells help us see that this is not part of ordinary life. We are invited to something extraordinary! A part of this invitation is to call to mind the times we have fallen into temptation.

The Penitential Act (the calling to mind our sins) is not meant to be a shameful exercise but the humble recognition that we need God's mercy. We have been given the call to BE PERFECT (Matt. 5:48). This call is not an exaggeration but a command from our Lord to accept His invitation. We should never accept our sins as a part of life; instead, we should humbly seek the Divine Physician's healing remedy. Our venial sins are forgiven during the penitential act to help us prepare for the awe-inspiring feats ahead.

The penitential act has several options.

1. Praying the Confiteor (which means "confess" in Latin) followed by the absolution prayer by the priest, then the Kyrie Eleison (Lord, have mercy)
2. The next option may surprise you. The underutilized second option is a dialogue between the priest and the people. The priest says, "Have mercy on us, O Lord." The people reply, "For we have sinned against you." Then the priest says, "show us,

O Lord, your mercy." The people respond, "And grant us your salvation." The absolution prayer and the Kyrie then follow.

3. The third option is the common invocations or tropes that end with Lord, have mercy. The absolution then follows.

After the Penitential Rite, we sing the Gloria. As you know, during the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, the Gloria is omitted. We give glory and praise to God as we free ourselves from sin and prepare to enter more deeply into the Church's prayer. We have the Collect or opening prayer after singing this Heavenly Hymn of the Angels.

Like the opening Antiphon, the Collect is particular to each Mass and, again, helps us focus on the specific season, day, or feast that we are celebrating. This Sunday, we pray:

O God,
protector of those who hope in you,
without whom nothing has firm foundation,
nothing is holy,
bestow in abundance your mercy upon us and
grant that,
with you as our ruler and guide,
we may use the good things that pass in such
a way as to hold fast even now to those that
ever endure.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of
the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Amen.

After the Collect, we begin the Liturgy of the Word.

May God Bless you throughout this week!

REFLECTION: SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME A TRULY WISE PERSON

The ending of today's Gospel speaks about "the new and the old." Jesus is saying that a person "instructed in the kingdom" has wisdom both old and new; in other words, that person learns from the past as well as from the present. Let's look at each of those.

We learn from the past by studying it. So the wisdom of the kingdom comes first from the scriptures. The more familiar we are with the word of God, the more wisdom we possess. We can also learn from the lives of the saints and writings of the Church. If you only have time to go to Mass on Sunday, just listening to the homily can help to apply the scriptures to your life.

One way we can learn from "the new" is to learn from our mistakes. That includes learning from our sins. When we are truly sorry, we make an effort to change our ways. We can also learn from the mistakes and the successes of our friends. As we share our faith with them, we share the stories of our lives, both good and bad. God can speak to us through a friend or relative whose advice we seek. A truly wise person is one who has received a lifetime of good advice.

THE DEACON'S CORNER



A Reflection: "Jesus departed to the mountain to pray, and he spent the night in prayer to God." Luke 6:12

During a restless night when I couldn't get back to sleep, my mind went over the events of the past day. In the midst of a beautiful late-summer day, there had been bad news and sad news. The bad news was from a friend who called from his hospital bed with a grim diagnosis. The sad news was that two elderly women whom I had known for many years had died. Prayers were now very important for each of the families.



As I was pondering all of this, I thought of a priest who had died several years ago. Father Michael Seger was a scholar, a teacher, a friend, and a good mentor as I was still learning how to be a deacon. Even with all of his academic achievements, what he loved most was just being a parish

priest. When he came home to his childhood roots at St. Teresa Church in Price Hill, he arrived at what he always referred to as "God's Holy Mountain". Price Hill was the place of his youth where he first felt called to serve God in a special way. As I thought about Father Michael, I thought about my friend in the hospital. They had known each other for many years. They had both worked together serving the Church until Father Michael's illness took him home to the Lord. Given the current situation, I believe it is time to call upon Father Michael on "God's Higher Holy Mountain" to intercede to Jesus on behalf of my friend who is suffering.

A Prayer: Through the intercession of Father Michael before Jesus, may the Lord grant healing of body and spirit to my friend and brother. And may the Lord grant peace and comfort to the families of the women who have now gone home to the Lord. Amen ~DEACON DAVE

"ALWAYS FORWARD!"

St. Junipero Serra

This is the fifth installment on the life of Saint Junipero Serra (1713-1784).

In 1770, Junipero Serra accompanied a Spanish overland expedition to Alta (Upper) California, led by Gaspar de Portola y Rovira. This journey led to the foundation of the "presidio" (military and civilian post) of Monterey (50 miles south of the future San Francisco) where Father Serra established the St. Charles Borromeo mission on June 3, 1770. The following year, in an attempt to avoid disputes with the governor of the presidio as well as to find better farmland, he moved the mission further south, closer to the Carmel River. This is where he established his headquarters for the remaining fourteen years of his life. Between 1770 and 1782, true to his motto "Always forward!", he founded the first nine mission in Upper California (now the present state of California), despite the opposition of the governor of California, Neves, a disciple of Voltaire. By 1794, these nine missions would comprise 4,650 Amerindians and 38 Franciscans. Twelve other Franciscan missions were founded between the death of Father Serra and 1823.

In 1776, while Jefferson, Adams, Franklin and others were voting for independence from Great Britain, Father Palou under the authority of Father Serra, celebrated Mass in front of a hut and founded the mission of Saint Francis of Assisi, which became the starting point of the metropolis of San Francisco. Another mission, Saint Mary of the Angels, was named after the shrine in Assisi, Italy where Saint Francis died. The present-day metropolis of Los Angeles was built around it.

Junipero and his religious brothers were sometimes in conflict with the civil authorities. In August 1770, Pedro Fages, governor of the presidio of Monterey, permitted a number of disorders: soldiers mistreated the natives and kidnapped indigenous women to use as concubines. As the governor had complete control over the mail, Serra decided to go to Mexico City himself to submit a "Representación" (complaint) to Viceroy Bucareli, demanding that the Indians be treated as human beings and proposing concrete measures to that end.

The journey (2000 miles on foot!) was further complicated by its secretive nature and the health problems of the 60-year old Father; it lasted three years! Father Serra's "Representación" which has sometimes been described as the "Declaration of Rights of the Amerindians," was accepted by the Spanish civil authorities and was quite widely implemented.

On November 4, 1775, Kumeyaay Indians attacked the San Diego mission, destroying all its buildings and killing Brother Luis Jaime. This aggression led to prosecution by the civil authorities; two years



later, twenty natives were sentenced to death. Not all of them were murderers. Father Serra immediately wrote to the Viceroy and reminded him of a previous request: "If the natives, whether pagans or Christians, were to kill me or other Brothers, they should be forgiven." Viceroy Moncada knew from experience that the Franciscans obtained more through gentleness than the soldiers through severity, and so he once again acceded to the request: the rebels escaped the death penalty!
