PASTOR'S COLUMN

August 6, 2023

Dear Westside Catholic Family,

Today we will continue our walk through the Mass by focusing briefly on the Liturgy of the Word. I like how Bishop Baron introduces how natural our celebration is. It usually follows a particular pattern when we think about having a meal with friends and family. We begin with greetings (the Introductory Rites), and before the meal (Liturgy of the Eucharist), we have time to share our stories. This is all elevated at our celebration of the Mass. And the stories we share, although we may think them to be a distant reality, are the stories that have shaped our salvation. It is the greatest story ever told, not foreign but one that shapes and is reshaped by our particular engagement with them.

We generally begin with a reading from one of the Old Testament books. These are the stories of our Jewish ancestors. They primarily focus on the theme of returning to God. From the first moment of the fall, God searches for and sends help to his people. God did not desire us to live outside of the original harmony that was first created. Yet, repeatedly, we, his people, turn away from living in that relationship. The Old Testament is a testament of God's ever-present love and desire for us to be who we have been created to be.

After the first reading, we sing the responsorial psalm. The Psalms, credited in all large part to King David, are the prayers of God's people. There are psalms of joy, love, happiness, anger, and fear. Almost any human emotion can be found in these beautiful prayers. And an even more beautiful reality is that these are the prayers our Lord would have known and prayed. We connect the human and divine in a powerful way.

The second reading comes from the New Testament. These letters from the

early Church remind us of the growth, the challenges, and the movement of the Holy Spirit. They serve as a constant reminder that things are not static but ever-changing. This change can be hard at times, but we also know that we can rely upon the Holy Spirit with trust and faith.

The proclamation of the Gospel follows the second reading. These are the accounts of our Lord's actions. Throughout the year, we are invited into the climax of our story of salvation. From the moment of the fall, God calls, and ultimately, He sends His Son to restore what was lost and offer an even greater gift, a share in Divine Life. We stand at the Gospel in recognition of the gift that was given and continues to be poured out upon the Church.


This is a reminder that these stories we hear should not be a distant historical rendering, but we are invited to live in the reality they reveal. The revelation is our call to follow Christ and enter into a relationship with our God. Our relationship with our Heavenly Father is the reason for our very being.

A homily follows the Gospel. The homily is an opportunity for the priest to explain how the Mystery of salvation history and the Mystery of the Mass intersect with our lives. There are many ways and styles that are utilized to try to do this well, but ultimately, it is through the Holy Spirit that the preacher hopes to reach the people.

The Creed and the petitions follow the homily. Compellingly the Creed is our response to what we have just heard. The Creed is our statement of belief that these stories speak to the reality being lived out in our faith. And it is this faith that then moves us to open our hearts and ask the Father to hear our deepest needs. We lift up our prayers with confidence, having seen how He has worked and continues to work within our lives.



ST LAWRENCE DEACON AND MARTYR AUGUST 10

Having died a martyr for Christ, St. Lawrence is the patron of deacons, chefs and firefighters. Around the time of his feast day, which is



celebrated on August 10, the night sky is lit with bright lights. The phenomenon is related to the passing of a meteorite swarm left by a comet. For folk tradition these lights are "falling stars", tears St. Lawrence shed during his martyrdom.

The martyr of the least

The testimony of this holy martyr, born in Spain in the first half of the 3rd century, is marked by piety and charity. Immediately after his election, Pope Sixtus II entrusted him with the care of the archdiocese. As the deacon responsible for charitable activities in the diocese of Rome, Saint Lawrence administered goods and catered to the needs of orphans, widows, and the poor generally.

Guardian of the "Church Treasures"

His journey was shaken in youth by the drama of persecution. In AD 258, Emperor Valerian issued an edict: all bishops, priests and deacons must be put to death. Saint Lawrence, other deacons, and Pope Sixtus II were apprehended. The Pope was killed on 6 August. At first, the emperor offered to spare Lawrence's life, in exchange for his handing over of "the treasures of the Church." Lawrence is said to have presented the emperor with the sick, the needy, and the marginalized. These, he said, are the treasures of the Church. Four days later, on August 10, Saint Lawrence would be martyred.

From martyrdom to glory

Saint Lawrence's martyrdom is a supreme testament to love. Saint Leo the Great, in a homily, commented on the condemnation of St. Lawrence, "The flames could not overcome the charity of Christ; and the fire burning him without was weaker than the one he had burning within him." St. Leo adds, "The Lord has desired to exalt his glorious name in the world so much that from the East to the West, in the lively flaring of the light radiated by the greatest deacons, the same glory that came to Jerusalem from Stephen has also touched Rome thanks to Lawrence."

The Basilica of Saint Lawrence and the church in Panisperna

After his death, the body of Saint Lawrence was laid in a tomb on the *Via Tiburtina*. In this place, Emperor Constantine erected a basilica that was restored in the 20th century after damage caused during WWII by the US bombing of Rome on July 19, 1943. In the place of his martyrdom was built the church of San Lorenzo in Panisperna. According to some sources, the name derives from the custom of Franciscan friars and Poor Clares, of distributing bread and ham – *panis et perna* – to the poor on August 10, Saint Lawrence's feast day.





"OBTAINING MORE THROUGH GENTLENESS"


St. Junipero Serra

This is the sixth installment on the life of Saint Junipero Serra (1713-1784).

Junipero Serra baptized over 5,000 Native Americans in California. After being granted a delegation of faculties by the Pope (a rare occurrence at the time) he administered to a further 6,000 the sacrament of Confirmation, an act normally reserved for the bishop. Sensing that his end was near, he set off on a final tour of his beloved missions. "My life is in California," he wrote, "and God willing, it is here that I hope to die." He returned to Monterey in a state of exhaustion on August 20, 1784, but he continued to pray, sing and dance wit the natives. A doctor who examined him the next day warned him that his state of health was serious and that he should seek treatment. But the treatments administered to the patient were ineffective. On the night of the 27th to the 28th, Father Serra asked for the last sacraments. Together with the missionaries present, he recited the seven penitential psalms and the litanies of the saints. More than once, he tried to kneel on his prie-Dieu. He then received absolution with plenary indulgence. In the morning, Father

Palou found him prone, with an expression of profound serenity on his face, holding the large crucifix that he had been carrying with him since his arrival in the New World. Father Junipero Serra had given up his soul to God, virtually without agony. The news of his death immediately spread and crowds of people began to pour in. His corpse was religiously borne to the church. The laypeople obtained that the church remains open all night so that they could wake him. A solemn funeral was held the next day. The small local garrison and the crew of the Spanish ship lying in the harbor would have been totally helpless if any disturbance had occurred, but all proceeded calmly and with great fervor. The relics were guarded to prevent them from being stolen by indelicate faithful. The relics of Saint Junipero continue to be venerated in Monterey-Carmel to this day, in the basilica of the mission he himself had founded.

We'll conclude in next Sunday's bulletin with a response to the slanders and senseless acts of vandalism that have occurred in recent times concerning the dedicated life and work of Saint Junipero Serra.

THE FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION GOD'S DIVINE ATTRIBUTES

Today's Feast of the Transfiguration is rather mind boggling. Jesus took his disciples on a hike up a mountain and turned it into a journey they would never forget. They fell to their knees in awe, for "he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." And their lives were never the same because they had been shown without a shadow of doubt that Jesus was the true God.

The Church helps us unravel this divine appointment by explaining God's attributes. God is Infinite: He is not confined by time or space. God is Unity: He is the one, true God and there is no other. God is Simple: He is not composed of any physical or metaphysical parts; He simply is. God is Divine: He is the creator and sustainer of all being. God is Eternal: He always was, always is, and always will be. God is Omnipresent: He is not confined by any temporal limitations; He is everywhere. God is Immutable: He is incapable of any type of change; Since he is perfection itself, He cannot change. God possesses Divine Knowledge, Intellect and Will: He knows all things, understands all things and orchestrates all things according to his divine plan.

After being reminded of Who and What God is, how can we do anything but respond in awe and wonder? Let us listen to God's message today, allow ourselves to be moved by it, and respond in faith to our great and loving God. loving God.
