PASTOR'S COLUMN

August 13, 2023

Dear Westside Catholic Family,

Before we continue looking at the Mass, I want to encourage all of you to think about one or two people you might consider inviting to this year's upcoming RCIA. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the catechetical and liturgical rites that help people enter into the faith. I encourage you to pray and think about some people who you would like to invite to this opportunity. RCIA is directed at people who are entering into the faith, but it is also open and an excellent opportunity for all of us to learn and deepen our faith. Our family RCIA program is open to everyone. If you know someone interested in becoming Catholic or at least learning more about the faith, please invite them. RCIA meets on Wednesday starting September 13th at St. William Church. We begin with the Holy hour at 6pm followed by our catechetical discussion.

Last week we ended our journey through the Mass by looking at the Liturgy of the Word ending with our proclamation of the Creed. Our profession of faith is our acclimation of belief in what we have just heard and about what we will experience shortly.

Following the Creed, we offer the Universal Prayers, also known as the Prayer of the Faithful, Bidding Prayers, Petitions, and Intercessions. Although there are no set weekly petitions, they generally follow a similar pattern. The easiest

way to think about it is from big to small. We usually begin by praying for the church and the world, followed by nations and civic leaders. Then we pray for the local community and special, more immediate needs. The petitions conclude by praying for the sick, the faithful departed, the particular Mass intention, and any special intentions.

It is important to remember that prayer is both the opening of our hearts and minds to ask for God's Grace, and it is the opening of our hearts and minds to be transformed by God's Grace. It is fitting that the Universal Prayers come when they do in the Mass. We have just heard the "story" of our salvation, and as we prepare to partake in that salvation, we pause to respond to what we have heard and in confidence in what we are about to receive. We are reminded over and over again in the Mass of what our God has done and continues to do for His creation. The story of salvation is not a frozen historical event, a past memory, or a distant reality. No, it is one that includes the present and is opened in a profound way during our celebration of the Mass.

Let us offer a prayer of thanksgiving today as we celebrate Mass, knowing that our story of salvation is being written by the Love that our Father has for us!

TUESDAY, AUGUST 15th IS THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

The Solemnity of the Assumption celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. The *Catechism* explains that Mary "was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body" (CCC, 974). Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today.

When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ'" (CCC, 1025 citing St. Ambrose, *In Luc.*, 10, 121: PL 15 1834A.). We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of unborn children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid. Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live today can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support pregnant mothers and parents of young children? Do we prioritize showing our love to those who are ill or aging? Do we care for them in a way that respects God's gift of life?

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen

All employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish™: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse—Arch. Of Cincinnati Edition**.

In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprint, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most schools in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. Please direct questions regarding bulletin completion to your parish/school safe environment coordinator.

AHEAD OF HIS TIMES

St. Junipero Serra

This is the concluding article on the life of Saint Junipero Serra (1713-1784).

Although Saint Junipero has been celebrated for more than two centuries by both religious and secular American leaders, his legacy has been challenged in recent decades by American anti-Catholic movements. The humble Franciscan, whom Pope Francis has called "one of the founding fathers of the United States" (in 1848 the U.S. wrested Alta (Upper) California from Mexico), is accused of having promoted colonialism and enslaved Native Americans. The uproar resulted in the savage removal and destruction of statues of Junipers Serra and other church vandalism, in Los Angeles and San Francisco by rioters in June 2020. In response to these senseless acts, the California bishops stated on June 22: "The historical truth is that Serra repeatedly pressed the Spanish authorities for better treatment of the Native American communities. Serra was not simply a man of his times. In working with Native Americans, he was a man ahead of his times who made great sacrifices to defend and serve the indigenous population and work against an oppression that extends far beyond the mission era."

Jóse H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles and President of the American Bishops' Conference said: "I believe Fray Junipero is a saint for our times, the spiritual founder of Los Angeles (whose original name was "St. Mary of the Angels"), a champion of human rights, and this country's first Hispanic saint. Saint Junipero came not to conquer, he came to be a brother." "We have all come here and remained here for the sole purpose of their well-being and salvation" he once wrote of himself and his brothers.

Junipero Serra was canonized on September 23, 2015 by Pope Francis in Washington D.C. It was an "equipollent canonization" because of the proven popular veneration for the Saint, the recognition of a miracle was not required. "Father Junipero Serra," said the Pope in his homily, "He was the embodiment of 'a Church which goes forth,' a Church which sets out to bring everywhere the reconciling tenderness of God. Junipero Serra left his native land and its way of life. He was excited about blazing trails, going forth to meet many people, learning and valuing their particular customs and ways of life. He learned how to bring to birth and nurture God's life in the faces of everyone he met; he made them his brothers and sisters. Junipero sought to defend the dignity of the native community, to protect it from those who had mistreated and abused it.

At the end of her short earthly life, Saint Therese of Lisieux confided to a sister who was distressed to see her moving about with such difficulty in her convent because of her illness: "I am wailing for a missionary!" Following her example, everyone of us can participate in the missions, either directly or indirectly, by offering



prayers, sacrifices and sufferings to God so that, in accordance with the command of Jesus Christ, the Gospel may be proclaimed with confidence "to the ends of the earth," as Jesus said in the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 1:8)
