PASTOR'S COLUMN

August 27, 2023

"Amen"

After the Doxology, we proclaim, "Amen." We say that we believe and that our very life depends on what has taken place. Once we have made this declaration, we stand and pray using the words that Christ taught us.

Throughout the Mass, our posture says a lot about what we are doing. Standing is a natural position of prayer. Often times our hands are folded, or the priest's hands are outstretched in a manner of offering. At times during the Mass, we are seated. This is a natural position of receiving and being receptive. The primary time we sit during the Mass is during the readings and homily. And lastly, at times, we kneel. Kneeling is a position of vulnerability and adoration. It is a profound act of bowing before our God, so it makes sense that we kneel before the Eucharist at Mass.

After the "Our Father," we move on to the sign of peace. It is essential to realize what is happening at this point. The priest prays that the Church may know the peace that Christ offers. The Roman Missal explains, "The Rite of Peace follows, by which the Church asks for peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family, and the faithful express to each other their ecclesial communion and mutual charity before communicating in the Sacrament." The sign of peace is not primarily a time to acknowledge the people you have been sitting next to, but rather an outward symbol of the communion that will inwardly take place by our reception of the Holy Eucharist.

After the sign of peace, we pray the "Lamb of God" and prepare to receive our Lord's true presence in the Eucharist. The prayer right before receiving is so powerful. "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." At this decisive moment, we recall how blessed we are to be receiving our Lord. Something that we did not earn or merit but receive because of His love.

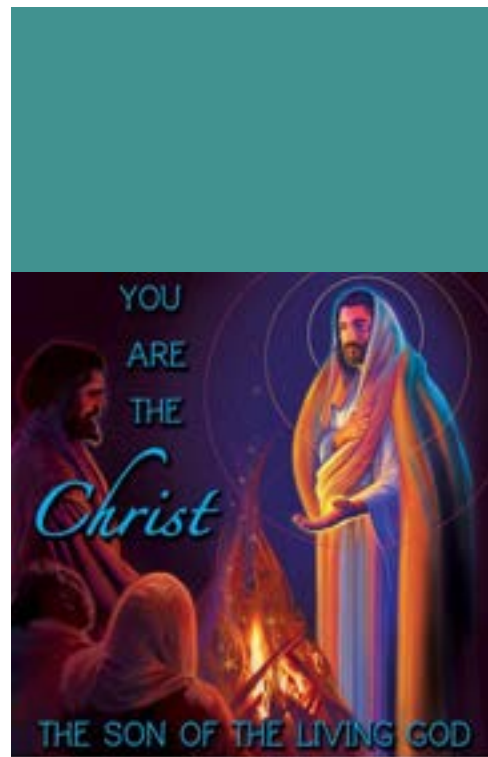
As the distribution of Holy Communion begins, we often sing a hymn or the antiphon. Just as in the beginning of Mass, the hymn or antiphon sets the tone of the Mass, so it is with the communion antiphon or hymn. This weekend's antiphon is, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, says the Lord, and I will raise him up on the last day."

After we finish with the communion rite, we rise to pray our final prayer, receive a blessing, and then be sent out. Even though this happens in quick progression, it is a very powerful part of the Mass. During the closing prayer, we often give thanks for what we have received and pray that we may put into effect the graces that have been given. After the blessing, we are sent out to live our faith in the world. We respond, "Thanks be to God." We are not saying thanks that this is over, but we are affirming and giving thanks to the mission that we have all been given. That mission is to go out into the world and allow our lives to be transformed by God and be a powerful witness to all we encounter.

"Thanks be to God!"

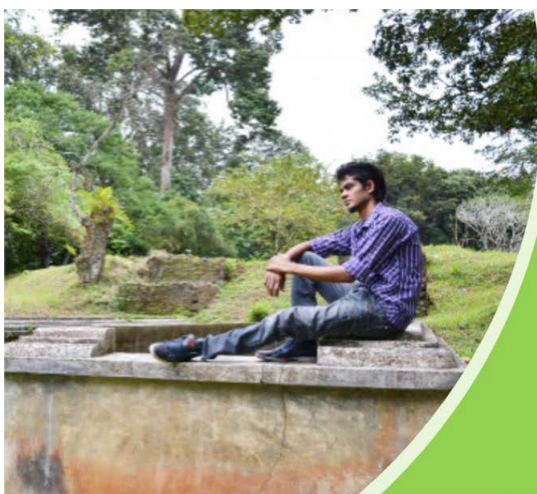

THE DEACON'S CORNER



A Reflection: "Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God." Matthew 5:8

This morning I was thinking about the old rock wall on both sides of my driveway that needs some patchwork. The years of freezing and thawing and hard rain have loosened some of the mortar, and the rocks need to be stabilized with new mortar. I did some of the work a while ago, but now I see other places that need attention.

As I thought about the task ahead of me, the condition of my soul came to mind. It could be likened to a rock wall. When it is newly baptized, it is beautiful and solid. Time hasn't had a chance to loosen the mortar and create cracks in the wall. Over time, the freezing and thawing of the world, the temptations and sin that can harden our hearts, causes weakness in the rock wall of our soul. Like the old walls in the driveway, my soul needs to be strengthened with new mortar, the mortar of God's grace.

Like patching the old wall with new mortar, it takes some work on my part to seek the grace to restore the beauty of my soul. That is where self-awareness of sin, and honesty come into play. If and when I admit my failures and seek forgiveness for my sins in the Sacrament of Confession, I can make my old wall, my old soul, strong and beautiful again. Any old broken down wall can be made new again with God's grace.

A prayer: Lord Jesus, we praise you and give you thanks for your love and grace. Thank you for the gift of mercy and forgiveness handed down to us in the Sacrament of Confession. When the rock wall of our souls begin to show cracks and weakness, may we always seek you with a sincere and sorrowful heart to restore our strength. We pray in Your Holy Name for you are Our Divine Savior, Amen.

TITLE "This is a Mirror" Blessed Anna Maria Taigi

We continue the amazing but true story of Blessed Anna Maria Taigi (1769-1837)

One day, on her way to Mass in her customary finery, Anna Maria, a wife and faithful Catholic, but worldly too, found herself near a priest, Father Angelo, of the Servite Order. The priest received an interior inspiration from the Lord: "I will entrust this woman to you: you will work with her for her conversion and she will become holy because I have chosen her..." For her part, after having led a life divided between the love of God and the love of the world, the young woman felt called better to align her way of life with her faith. The birth of her first child stimulated her in her spiritual life, for she was now a mother. She went to confession to Father Angelo, who did not recognize her at first. Shortly afterwards, she returned to the confessional and the same Father welcomed her with paternal warmth: "You have come at last!" From that day on, Anna Maria's life underwent a radical transformation. Household duties and works of charity became her daily occupations.

While praying before a crucifix towards the end of 1790, she heard Jesus Christ ask her: "What do you desire? To follow Jesus in His nakedness, stripped of everything? Or to follow Him in His triumph and glory? Which do you choose?" Anna

Maria replied: "I embrace the Cross of my Jesus; I will carry it as He did in pain and ignominy. As for the triumph and the glory, I desire to receive them from His hands in the hereafter."

Thus did Anna Maria generously offered to unite herself, as a victim of atonement, with the redemption wrought by Our Lord. She confided to Father Angelo her desire to form a religious life compatible with her state as a married woman. He suggested that she join a Third Order. With the consent of her husband, she was received into the Third Order of Trinitarians. The Order of the Trinitarians was founded in the 13th century by St. John of Matha and St. Felix of Valois, to redeem Christians who had fallen into the hands of the Muslims and were reduced to slavery; the mission of these religious, which was materially and spiritually arduous, was supported by devoted laymen who shared its graces and merits. After Anna Maria's death, her husband Domenico remembered: "My wife asked me for permission to become a tertiary of the Order of the Holy Trinity, and this I granted her, provided, however, that she would be faithful to her role as a wife and mother. Those were my conditions; she always observed them with prompt obedience and exactness."

But Anna Maria also received another mission: she was chosen by God to bear witness with invincible strength to the existence of the supernatural. To this end, she was granted a very exceptional gift: the permanent vision of a luminous globe or "sun" in which she could see all things, natural and supernatural. This phenomenon was to last 47 years, right up to her death. Our Lord said to her: "This is a mirror that I show you so that you may know the good and the evil that is being done." This sun, far from impairing her naturally deficient eyesight, actually made it stronger. She could see it at a distance of

approximately one yard in front of her, and a little higher than her head. It was about the size of the sun as we are used to see it, and it was surrounded by rays. Above it was a crown of thorns. On either side, a very long thorn reached down to the bottom of the disk where it formed a cross with the other. In the center of the disk was seated a woman who seemingly represented divine Wisdom. In the light of this sun, Anna Maria could see all the mysteries of the faith and the life of Christ, the state of consciences, the most secret thoughts of men, the fate of the dead, the situation of the different nations, revolutions, wars, the aims of governments, the scheming of secret societies, the snares of demons. sins... The vision of this sun was always at her disposal, and she used it only for the glory of God, when charity or obedience demanded it.

Thousands of facts bear witness of the reality of this phenomenon which cannot be attributed to the devil: the humility and obedience of Anna Maria, followed by innumerable conversions obtained as a result of the light coming from the sun, sufficiently demonstrate the divine origin of the gift she had received. She herself derived the greatest spiritual benefit from it because, as it allowed her to see her slightest faults and defects, she humbled herself very deeply. She was moved to pray and do penance for the salvation of sinners whose disorders she could see. On the subject of the mysteries of the faith, "she gave answers of a theological precision and accuracy that amazed the most learned," Fr. Angelo testified. This favor attracted to her a crowd of visitors—the poor, princes, priests, bishops, even the Pope himself—who came to her for advice. Simple and humble, and wishing to remain unnoticed, she answered very straightforwardly, shying away from praise, and always refusing even the smallest

gift, be it for herself or for her family.

IN THE LITURGY THIS WEEK

Monday, August 28: Saint Augustine, Bishop and Doctor of the Church. After a dissolute life Augustine was baptized at the age of 33 by St. Ambrose. He was converted by the prayers and penances and tears of his mother, St. Monica. He wrote his Confessions and the City of God. Over 500 of his homilies are extant.

Tuesday, August 29: The Passion (martyrdom) of Saint John the Baptist

Saint Augustine (354-430) created this poetic prayer to the Holy Spirit:

Breathe in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my thoughts may all be holy.
Act in me, O Holy Spirit,
That my work, too, may be holy.
Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit,
That I love but what is holy.
Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit,
To defend all that is holy.
Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit,
That I always may be holy.
