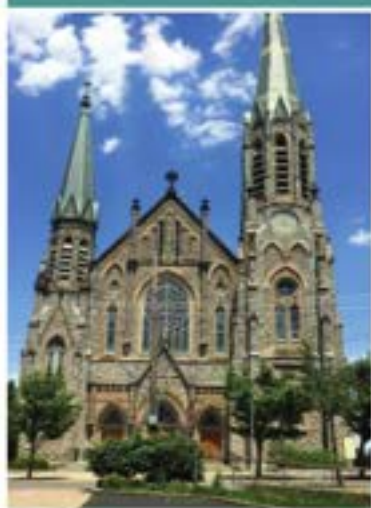

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Westside Catholic Family,

The Liturgy of the Eucharist takes place after the Liturgy of the Word. The focus of the Mass shifts from hearing the story of our salvation to us participating in that great story. The story we hear is not a distant reality but includes us.

We begin the liturgy of the Eucharist with the presentation of the gifts. This is a symbolic offering of bread, wine, and ourselves to God. There is a beautiful recognition that what we offer to God is woefully inadequate compared to what we receive. And yet, even being able to make any offering is itself a gift. In making this offering, we are caring for the needs of that Mass itself and for the needs of the Church.

Following the presentation of the gifts, the priest prays that God will accept and transform what we offer. The Eucharistic Prayer then follows. The Eucharistic prayer begins with the preface dialogue.

-The Lord be with you.

-And with your spirit.

-Lift up your hearts.

-We lift them up to the Lord.

-Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

-It is right and just.

The word Eucharist means

"Thanksgiving," and it is very clear from our preface prayer that we are giving thanks for God's great works.

At the end of the preface, we sing the "Santus," or "Holy, Holy, Holy." Through the praying and singing of the Santus, we are joining our prayers to those of the heavenly court and giving God Praise and Glory. We join all the angels and saints in the exaltation of our God.

The Eucharistic prayer can then take several forms depending on the priest's chosen option. However, all of the Eucharistic prayers have the following in common:

The Epiclesis

Calling the Holy Spirit to come upon our gifts. "by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration, that they may become the Body and Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ." (Eucharistic

Prayer II). The Church implores the power of the Holy Spirit that the gifts offered by human hands be consecrated, that is, become Christ's Body and Blood. (GIRM #79c)

The Institution Narrative

Here we recall the words of our Lord. This is the high point of our celebration. The priest in the person of Christ says the words of our Lord and it is here that the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of our Lord.

Anamnesis

The Church Remembers. During the Eucharistic prayer, the Church keeps the memorial of Christ by recalling His Passion, death, resurrection, and ascension into heaven. This is not a simple remembering, no, the liturgical act to remember is to make present the mysteries of Christ.

Offering (Anaphora)

".....as we await his coming in glory, we offer you his Body and Blood, the sacrifice acceptable to you which brings salvation to the whole world." (Eucharistic Prayer IV) The Church's intention is that the faithful not only offer this unblemished sacrificial Victim but also learn to offer their very selves. (GIRM #79) We make an offer of our Lord and of our Hearts to God that he will transform our lives.

Intercession

In union with the whole Church we pray for the Church and its pastors, for peace and unity, for the present community and for the dead.

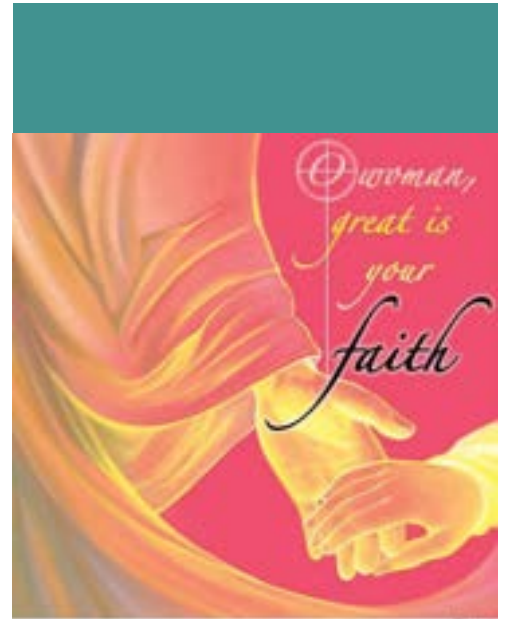
Final Doxology

"Through Him, and With Him, and In Him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is Yours, for ever and ever." The praise of God which is expressed in the doxology, is confirmed by the assembly's "Amen." The great "Amen" is a powerful acclamation of what has happened. "Amen" translates to "so be it." But it is so much more than just a passive word. No, it means I believe and I put my life on it. It is a statement proclaiming that this is the source of our true strength and happiness.

A MESSAGE FROM FR. JEFF STEGBAUER

+JMJ+

It has been a joy to be with you all at the Westside Catholic Family of Parishes—to worship Jesus together! I have met and continue to meet many wonderful souls here. Your kindness and warm welcome are humbling. I am especially thankful for your prayers. Please know that I pray for all of you every day—especially during Mass. I am looking forward to getting to know all of you better. To grab that cup of coffee and hear your story, so that we may help one another grow in holiness. All for the salvation of souls and for God's praise and glory.

In various homilies, I have briefly mentioned or alluded to having a sleep disorder. I wanted to take some time to more fully expand on this with all of you. It has been a long journey as the symptoms go back many years. After two sleep studies, many ineffective treatments, and several doctors, I was blessed to find my current sleep doctor. He is a specialist in neurological sleep disorders, and he diagnosed me with narcolepsy. This is a sleep disorder that is distinct from sleep apnea. Narcolepsy is not treated with a c-pap machine. I have been blessed with a mostly effective treatment for almost two years now. One of the challenges is that naps are rarely restorative for me—I am comically bad at waking up.

Even with the effective treatment, I am still groggy at times. For this reason, I have to carefully discern what to add to my calendar. If I push too hard for too long, I will render myself unsafe and unable to drive. Always humbling when those days come and I have to ask for help.

If you have ever noticed me yawning a lot during Confessions or appearing to be asleep during the Mass, it is not because I am bored, but because I have a sleep disorder. If I do not preach during a weekday Mass, it may be because silence is good for the soul, or because I'm tired.

I often fall into the trap of thinking my value comes from what I do, how much I do. Narcolepsy has been a blessing in reminding me that it is not in what I do, but in simply 'being.' Being a son of God, being a priest of Jesus Christ. All of that being said, I often wish I could have a different cross, but I have to remind myself that this is the cross that Jesus is asking me to carry for all of you. That every frustration is an invitation from the hand of God the Father to love my parishioners. I am definitely a long way away from embracing this cross well every time, but I promise to do my best. To do my best for all of you.

Please know of my prayers for all of you. Please continue to keep me in your prayers. Let us help one another to carry our Crosses. Let us help one another to become the saints that God created us to be.

In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprint, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most schools in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. 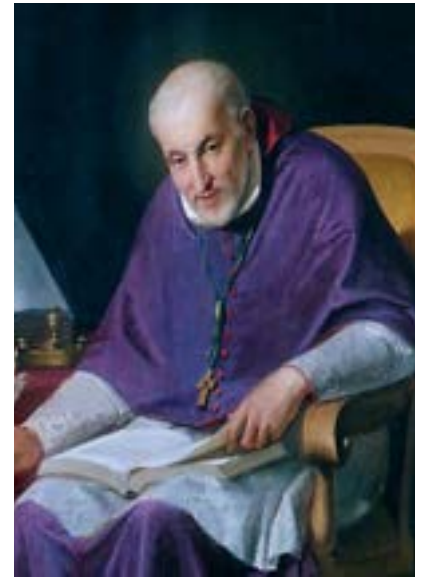

THE DEACON'S CORNER



A Reflection: "Love is not perfect. Oh, yes it is!"

A random thought came to me this morning. It was one of those thoughts that just comes out of nowhere. In a deacon's world, and most other clergy for that matter, we spend a lot of time at the beginning of loving relationships when preparing engaged couples for marriage. In each case, it is an in-depth study, trying to get a man and woman to think deeply about their compatibility and values. A great challenge in this effort is looking into the unknowns of the future.

Priests, deacons, and other ministers of various churches also spend a lot of time looking back on couple's lives at wedding anniversaries and at funeral Masses. It is a different story then. All of the unknowns of the future have already come and gone. To the elderly husband and wife who has lived all the experiences of married life, all of the memories are now captured in their minds. To the person of any age whose spouse has gone home to the Lord, they hold all those memories deep in their heart.

Love may not seem perfect to a married couple in their early years or even their middle years. There are a lot of bumpy roads and challenges along the way, some serious and some not that significant. St. Paul gives us a good look at the primary characteristics of what love is and what it is not. The words of First Corinthians 13 are often read at both weddings and funeral. For the young couple about to be married, St. Paul's description may seem like a list of ideals in a relationship. For the older folks who have lived a long life, and are now saying goodbye to the one they lived with and loved so long in their marriage, they would probably say that each of Paul's words had special meaning in their lives. They would probably also say that no matter how easy or difficult things got in their lives, love was perfect.

A prayer: Lord God, we give you all of our praise and thanks for the love that you give us each day. Thank you for the witness of elderly married couples who give witness to your love. Bless all of the young engaged couples who are preparing to commit themselves to each other in marriage. Help them to learn that in you they can find perfect love. In Jesus' Holy name we pray, Amen.

TITLE "I Have Chosen Her"
Blessed Anna Maria Taigi

"God chose the weak of the world to share the strong," Saint Paul tells us in First Corinthians 1:27. It is with these words that in 1863, Pope Pius IX justified opening the cause of beatification of a wife and mother: "When God wants to manifest His power and wisdom, He usually employs that which, in the eyes of the world, is weakness and folly, so as to render vain the enterprises of the godless, and to crush the labors of hell. In our day, He has pitted a mere woman against the floods of godlessness that have surged on all souls. For this work, He has used Anna Maria Taigi, born of honest but poor parents, married to a man of the people, burdened with the care of a family, and who found only in the work of her hands the means to feed herself and her children. She was chosen by God to draw souls to Himself, to be a victim of atonement, an obstruction to the schemes of the ungodly, and to prevent misfortunes by her prayers."

As Louis Veuillot, a famous French journalist, remarked, "In the 19th century, it was said that the reign of the Popes was over, that the law of Christ and Christ Himself were passing away, that science would soon relegate this so called Son of God to the ranks of the ghosts, and that He would no longer perform

miracles. And so God raised up Anna Maria Taigi who healed the sick. He gave her the knowledge of the past, the present, and the future. She was the answer of God!"

Anna Maria was born in Sienna, Tuscany (Italy) on May 29, 1769, the only daughter of Luigi Gianetti, a humble pharmacist, and his wife Maria. She was baptized the day after her birth. Six years later, financial setbacks compelled her father to abandon his trade, sell all his possessions to pay off his creditors, and hire himself out as a servant. His wife likewise had to find employment. Thanks to their hard work and modest lifestyle, the Gianettis were soon able to make a decent living in Rome. Anna Maria spent barely two years at school where she was taught both reading and the catechism. This allowed her to make her First Communion. Her parents took her to Mass almost every day. At the age of thirteen she entered the workforce as a seamstress. A devout and hard-working girl, she was however also very coquettish and enjoyed dressing up. Before long, she entered into domestic service, as had her parents. It was there that she experienced the dangers of having too much freedom, and the traps that the world can set for unwary souls. She met Domenico Taigi, eight years her senior, who worked as a day laborer in the palace of Prince Chigi. Having discerned her solid virtue, he offered to marry her. Anna Maria consulted God in prayer and accepted his proposal. Their marriage was celebrated in January, 1789. The young wife put up with her husband's difficult character: although an honest man, Domenico was also very hot-tempered.

Domenico was soon promoted to the position of butler, and given

lodgings in the palace of his masters. One day, on her way to St. Peter's Basilica in her customary finery, Anna Maria found herself near a priest, Father Angelo, of the Servite Order. The priest received an interior inspiration from the Lord: "I will entrust this woman to you: you will work for her conversion and she will become holy because I have chosen her."
