Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I also encourage you to join me and many around the archdiocese who will pray the 54-day novena leading up to the November election.

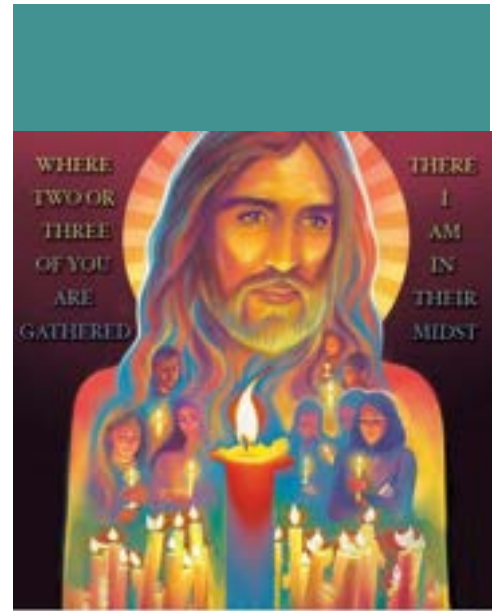

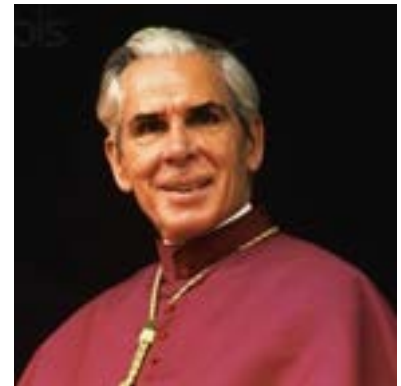

THE DEACON'S CORNER



A Reflection: "Who may go up the mountain of the Lord? Who can stand in his holy place? The clean of hand and pure of heart, who has not given his soul to useless things, what is vain. He will receive blessings from the Lord, and justice from his saving God." – Psalm 24:3-5

I occasionally hear the references "lost soul" or "darkened soul" when someone is being described as living an immoral or sinful life. Having been raised in the Christian life, I learned early in grade school that our soul is that part of each of us that is eternal. When our life is over and our body dies, the soul lives on in eternity. The body cannot live without the soul. It is what animates the body.

To be a "lost soul," or to have a "darkened soul," doesn't mean that the body has died. It means that the person of this description has chosen a path to live away from God. As all souls are meant to live in eternity with God, when a person chooses a path in life that leads them away from God and doesn't repent from that path, their soul is at a tremendous risk of existing in eternity in a permanent state of pain. We all have many choices in our lives. We can often

choose a path that leads us away from God if we are too proud or careless about our lives. When I hear the commonly expressed statement, "My body, my choice," in reference to abortion and reproductive activity, I cringe. Nobody ever says, "My soul, my choice," but that is what really matters.

A prayer: Lord God, we praise you and give you thanks for the gift of life. Thank you for the gift of our souls that are meant to seek you and to live in your presence in eternity. We ask your help to guard our souls from the evil one, and to change the hearts of souls that have been darkened or lost because of bad choices. In Jesus' Holy Name we pray, Amen.

TITLE "Just Once a Week" Blessed Anna Maria Taigi

We continue the story of Blessed Anna Maria Taigi (1769-1837).

Anna Maria used to go to early morning Mass, unless a member of the family was ill, in which case she would forego Mass in order to take care of her patient. She held the sacraments in high esteem, and recommended frequent confession. She would have liked to go to confession every day, but her confessor ordered her to be satisfied with just once a week. However, he allowed her to take Holy Communion every day, a rare practice at the time. Whenever she knelt before the tabernacle, Anna Maria would become completely motionless, and nothing could keep her away from this, except obedience. Sometimes, during Communion the Sacred Host would slip from the priest's fingers and come to rest on her lips.

The purpose of the seven sacraments, instituted by Our Lord Jesus Christ, "is to sanctify people, to build up the Body of Christ, the Church and, finally, to give worship to God. Because they are signs they also instruct. They not only presuppose faith, but by words and objects they also nourish, strengthen, and express it... They are efficacious because in them Christ Himself is at work: it is He who baptizes, He who acts in His sacraments in order to

communicate the grace that each sacrament signifies... The Church affirms that for believers the sacraments of the new Covenant are necessary for salvation... The fruit of the sacramental life is that the Spirit of adoption makes the faithful partakers in the divine nature by uniting them in a living union with the only Son, the Savior."

(Catechism of the Catholic Church, Nos. 1123, 1127, 1129)

Anna Maria had a deep veneration for the Blessed Virgin, who granted her special graces, and sometimes appeared to her. The Crucifix had a place of honor in her home, and she wore one as a pendant as a constant reminder of God's love, and an exhortation to sacrifice and penance: "Love for love!" The clear vision given her by the luminous globe was the source of many sufferings (Anna Maria was granted a very exceptional gift: the permanent vision of a luminous globe or "sun" in which she could see all things, natural and supernatural). Moreover, a number of illnesses caused her to suffer strange and unexplainable pains. Our Lord had once told her: "I have chosen you to be placed in the ranks of the martyrs... Your life will be a protracted martyrdom for the sake of the faith."

And again: "I want to make you feel my gentleness, and how agreeable those who love me are to me. I have destined you to the conversion of souls and to the consolation of people of every rank and condition... You will have to struggle against false and evil souls, you can expect to be mocked, reviled, despised, and overwhelmed with insults; all this you will endure for the sake of my love." The devil's violent assaults also caused her to be tempted, sometimes in very subtle ways, against this or that dogma of the Church, in particular those of eternal life and the existence of hell. In these battles, Anna Maria relied

on humility, prayer, and the names of Jesus and Mary. Well aware of her own weakness, she begged the Lord to hold her firmly in His grace, lest she betray Him. Her intense love of God led her to develop a deep abhorrence of sin, and make her turn unceasingly towards the mysteries of the life of Christ and of the Holy Trinity.
