PASTOR'S COLUMN September 17, 2023

Dear Westside Catholic Families,

As promised, I am devoting some time in my column to discuss Beacons of Light this Fall. Again, if at any time you have questions, don't hesitate to contact me because you are probably not the only one with the same questions.

I would like to go back to the beginning with the first and probably the biggest question of them all. Why is the Archdiocese going through Beacons of Light?

First, let's look at some numbers.

- Religious practice has been declining in both the United States and in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. From 2010 to 2019, sacramental practice (including Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations and Weddings) in the Archdiocese declined by 23%.
- Our current infrastructure and schedules were built for a different era. In many cases our church buildings are grossly underutilized. In the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, the average Sunday Mass is about one-third full.
- Our resources are largely consumed by efforts to maintain the status quo and are spread too thin to be truly effective. In particular, our priests are stretched to the limit, and we will have fewer priests who can serve as pastors over the coming years. The number of archdiocesan priests available for assignment is projected to decline by approximately 20% over the next five years.

I know these facts can seem grim. But the reality is we have fewer people practicing the faith and a lower number of priests who can serve as pastors. The question then becomes how we will respond? Truthfully, there are several options. We could do nothing and let things continue going as they are going. (The phrase, if nothing changes, nothing changes, comes to mind.) We could immediately close down a large number of Churches to correspond to the numbers. (This would be an abrupt change that would alienate many people.) Or we can take a period of time to assess the situation on a local level and make the needed adjustments to move forward. The latter option was chosen as the best path forward. This leads to a few more questions, but the one I will focus on today is, "What does moving forward mean?"

Moving forward does not mean managing decline. Truthfully, that is what we have been doing for many vears. We find ourselves at a time when we cannot afford to continue on that path. Again, we do not have the number of practicing Catholics or the number of priests to sustain that model. Moving forward also does not mean mindlessly cutting things away for the sake of change. The first goal of Beacons of Light is evangelization. We need to share the faith! However, it has become evident that at times, the resources that we have are being used less on building up the faith and more on the buildings of the faith. Don't get me wrong, our buildings and especially our beautiful Churches are so important. They are such works of art dedicated to the glory of God that it should be our mission to use them as they were intended - as worship places of with congregations, not as museums of a bygone era. Beacons of Light is about making sure that we are on mission (deepening and growing the faith) and that the infrastructure supports that mission. In short, what we have must support who we are. We can ask the question about every aspect of our parishes, "Is this supporting the mission?" Much of the time, the answer is, "Yes." This time of reorganization allows us to ensure that who we are will be alive, vibrant, and effective for many years to come.

Throughout this process, it can be tempting to jump to conclusions about what the future holds. I encourage you to be hesitant to do that and to continue to pray that the Holy Spirit guides us during this time.




PSR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN FOR THE 2023-24 SCHOOL YEAR



THE DEACON'S CORNER

A Reflection: "Naomi said, 'See now! Your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and her god. Go back after your sister-in-

law!' But Ruth said 'Do not ask me to abandon or forsake you! For wherever you go, I will go, wherever you lodge I will lodge, your people shall be my people, and your God my God."-Ruth 1:15-16

I ran into a friend the other evening at an outdoor café. He had just caught the last ferry boat across the river from Kentucky. It was his routine several times a week to go to a Kentucky casino/ horse track and have a meal and play the slots. His wife had died about three years ago. They had been married over 55 years. His wife was confined to a wheelchair for a few years before she died. When she was alive, he would take her to the casinos and different places so that she wasn't isolated at home. He seemed lost for a while after she died, but he developed a routine that mirrored what they had done as a couple. No doubt, he still carries her with him in his heart when he makes his daily rounds. In his married life, my friend reflected the patience and kindness that Saint Paul has written about. He still does.

The biblical story of Ruth begins with a triple tragedy. Her father-in -law dies, and then Ruth's husband and brother-in-law both die. This leaves Naomi, her mother-in-law, without a husband or her two sons. In ancient Israel, this situation would leave a woman, especially an older woman, destitute with no means of supporting herself. Even though given the opportunity to leave Naomi to find another husband, Ruth professes lovalty to her mother-in-law. She would not leave her starving and Through the destitute. chapters of Ruth, we see her loyalty continue, and Naomi even helps her to find a new husband. The story has a good ending.

A good lesson from this story is to stay close to those who feel isolated by the loss of a loved one. Don't let them linger in sadness and poverty of spirit. A little kindness each day can lift their heart.

A prayer: Lord God, we give you all praise and thanks for the goodness of each day. Thank you for the lesson of compassion and loyalty that your daughter Ruth has taught us in the Bible. May we follow her example of compassion and loyalty in reaching out to those who have experienced the loss of their loved ones. In Jesus' Holy Name we pray, Amen.

"THE ONLY FUTURE"Blessed Anna Maria Taigi

We continue the remarkable life and spiritual insights of Blessed Anna Maria Taigi (1769-1837).

She well knew that the way to Heaven is the faithful observance of God's commandments. In an address at Mount Sinai, on February 26, 2000, Saint John Paul II said: "At the heart of our religion is the mystery of liberating obedience, which finds in the perfect its fulfillment obedience of Christ in the Incarnation and on the Cross. We too shall be truly free if we learn to obey as Jesus did. The Ten Commandments are not an arbitrary imposition of a tyrannical Lord. They were written in stone; but before that, they were written on the human heart as the universal moral law, valid in every time and place.

Today as always, the Ten Words of the Law provide the only true basis for the lives of individuals, societies and nations. Today as always, they are the only future of the human family. They save man from the destructive force of egoism, hatred and falsehood. They point out all the false gods that draw him into slavery: the love of self to the exclusion of God, the greed for power and pleasure that overturns the order of justice and degrades our human dignity and that of our neighbor. If we turn from these false idols and follow the God who sets His people free and remains always

with them, then we shall emerge like Moses, after forty days on the mountain, 'shining with glory,' ablaze with the light of God!"

Although she spread peace and light all around her, Anna Maria went through the ordeal of the dark night of the soul for twenty years, but she continued to run her house as if nothing were amiss. "Heavenly consolations disappeared like a flash of lightning, leaving only dryness, suffering and work," one witness later testified, adding: "Heaven was like bronze to her...Yet God did not deprive her of the supernatural lights with which she was blessed, but these lights were no relief to the terrible interior desolation that engulfed her." Her confessor also testified that "the tribulations that overwhelmed her were never able to extinguish the fire burning in her heart."

Temptation is a part of life for Christians, but it is not sin. Sin is committed when the will consents to the evil thought. Acts of live towards Jesus Christ and appealing to the Virgin Mary, especially through the short "ejaculatory prayers," are very helpful in repelling temptations, for example: "Jesus, I trust in You!"

Anna Maria Taigi's charity extended to the souls in Purgatory: "Be very devoted to the souls in Purgatory," she often repeated, "especially the souls of priests! Have Masses said for them when you can. Make a habit of praying for them every day. This devotion will guard you and your whole family from many ills." Once liberated, many of these souls came to than her. Anna Maria knew by revelation that the fate of many who had died. She once saw a clergyman who had been greatly esteemed for his zeal and energy cruelly being tormented Purgatory, because instead of the glory of God, he had sought above



all his personal reputation.

In contrast, on another occasion, she saw the soul of a humble Capuchin friar, the saintly Brother Felix of Montefiascone, ascend directly to Heaven.


